






Two items of interest are their annual slumber party for the Seniors who are honorary members and only attend parties, and the informal initiation with pledges dressed, this year, in toyland fashion.

The newest organization to be added to the many already offered at our school, is the Varsity Club. Such variety does much to enhance our school life as each individual may choose those best suited to their interests.

This club has several appealing factors for those qualified as their objectives are to promote school spirit, a better association between athletics and the public and also between the athletes themselves, better scholarship among members, and an increased interest in varsity athletics is another goal to be achieved. Those eligible for membership are boys who have won a letter although a few others qualify under special cases.

It is here one receives his basic ground work, which will be enriched and added to until, one day, he will reach his goal and attain that most coveted possession, a letter.


