Finishing with a record of $3-6$, the varsity accomplished a majority of their pre-season goals. The Northmen managed to keep every game close and lost only one game by more than seven points. Coach Dave Farris was proud of his players and commended them for their noble efforts. Leading the Northmen in tackles was Don Thorn (95) with 96 tackles ( 65 solo tackles) and three-time letter winner Jon Kallio (94) with 90 tackles.
