# Road Trip

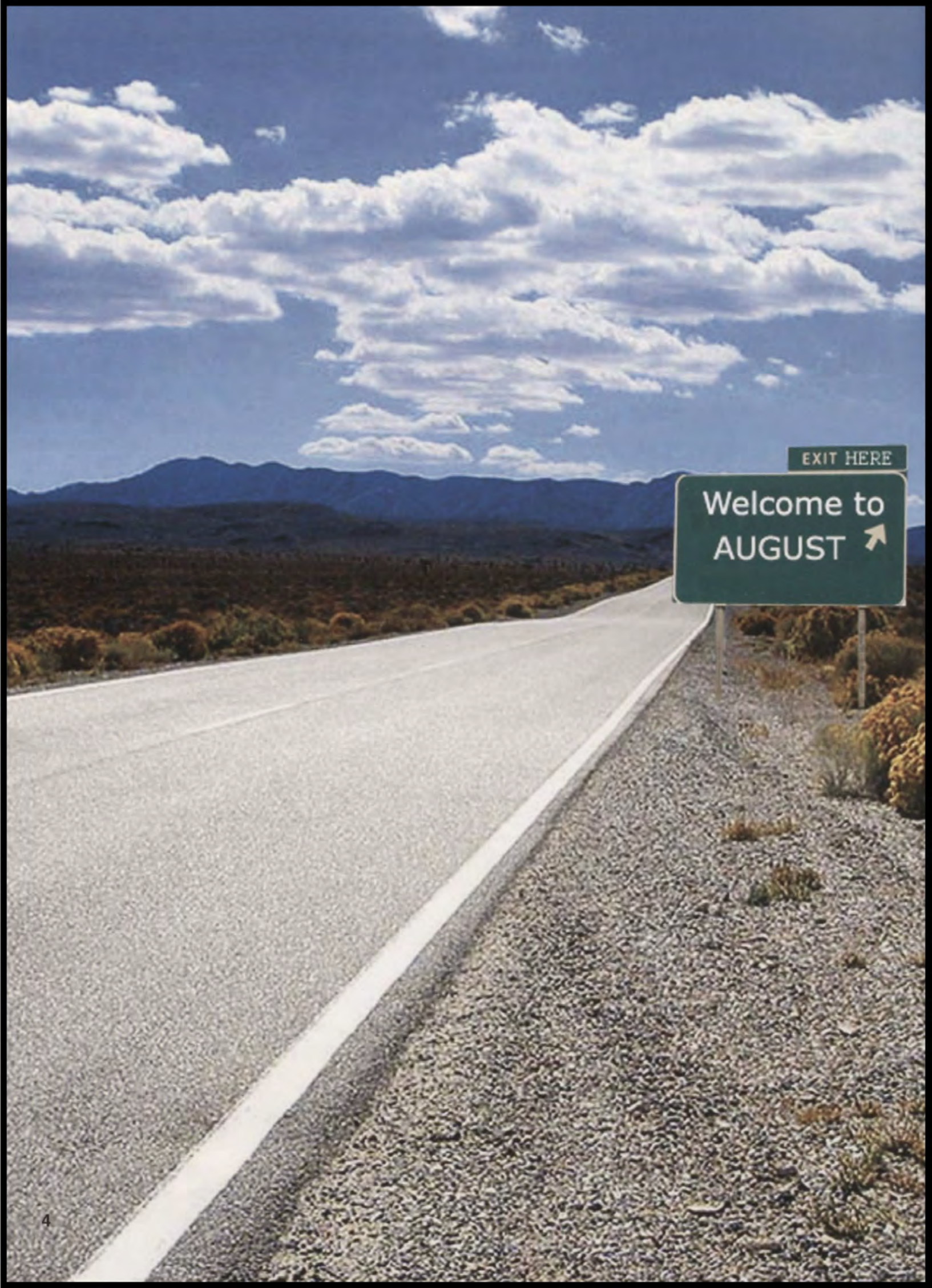

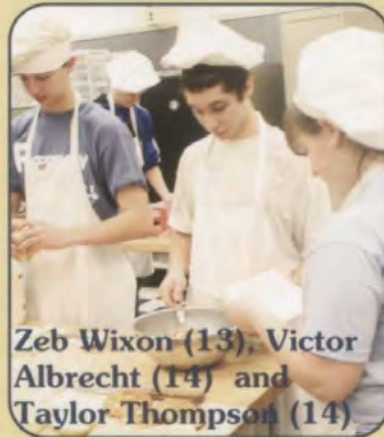


# Culinary, Straight Ahead

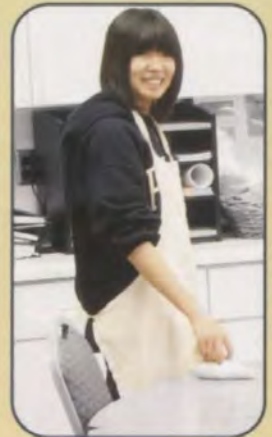

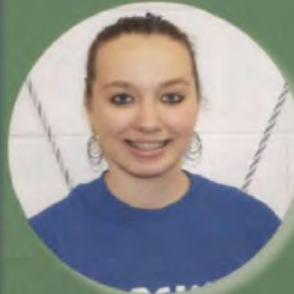
# Healthy Habits = Healthy Road to Success

The 2010-2011 yearbook was published by the Jostens Yearbook Company.

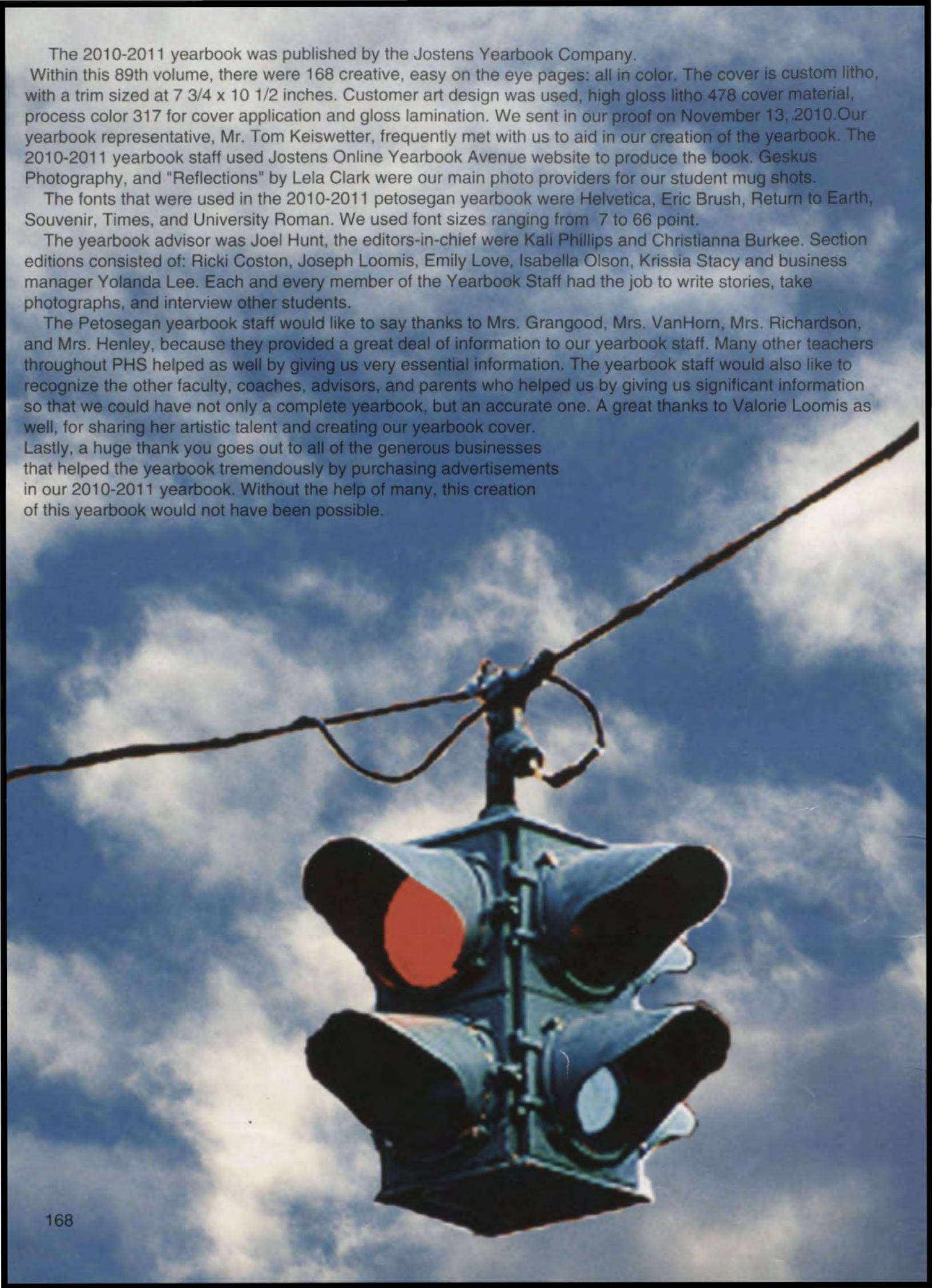
