M eet Jen – she is a full-time working mom with four kids from second grade to sixth grade: Rachael, Robert, Maddie, and Lauren.

Four years ago, Jen found out that her kids were reading just below the grade level bar and Jen was concerned due to the State of Michigan’s Read by Grade Three Law. She was worried that her first grader at the time would be held back a grade, even though she was thriving in all other areas. As a working mom with a house full of kids, “it can be difficult to find the time to sit down and work with the kids, and really give them the quality time that is needed.”

Jen heard through the Public Schools of Petoskey about a new program at the Petoskey District Library, Growing Readers Together (GRT). She wondered if this may be a good solution for her. The GRT program has trained and experienced tutors that would work with her kids in a focused manner.



This could affect positive change for her kids and take some of the pressure off her. As Jen watched her kids struggle with reading during their first two years of school, she was “so happy to find this little extra help.” Jen jumped at the chance to register her kids for the program.

What she found is wonderful tutors who create trusting relationships. Jen saw wonderful results with her first two kids, so as time went by and her younger kids were struggling a bit with reading – she registered them as well. All four kids have appreciated the availability of the program, especially the tutors. They all love their tutors and the connections they have. Jen credits the tutors with keeping the kids engaged so they can truly learn and improve, “Rachael went from being afraid of reading to enjoying it.” Rachael is now reading chapter books, “I really like the *Wings of Fire* books.” Maddie piped in that she also is reading chapter books and “loves the *Owl Diaries*.”

Another bonus of visiting the Library is that the kids love the Children’s department. While they wait for the siblings to take their turns with the tutor, they spend time with books and the games in the Children’s room. Rachael especially likes the floor tiles and Lauren likes the comfortable chairs and big books. Jen is happy to report that all her kids have improved their reading skills and are doing really well in school and they love visiting the Library.

When asked if the GRT program has changed them, Robert said, “It helped me because today I said I want to do more reading!” Jen credits the Growing Readers Together program for removing an obstacle so she could support her kids on their reading journey. “They wouldn’t like to read as much and would still be struggling if not for the program.” Because of the Growing Readers Together program, Jen has watched her kids improve their reading skills and strengthen their journey of being life-long readers and life-long library lovers.

It's back-to-school time and the Library is gearing up for another year of our Growing Readers Together (GRT) program. GRT is a partner project between the Petoskey District Library and the Public Schools of Petoskey. While the program is beginning its fifth year, it is still based on the three-pronged approach to support children in their reading quest. GRT provides direct tutoring for students, monthly Family Literacy Nights, and Brain Boxes to check out and take home.

One-on-one tutoring for students in need takes place at the Library throughout the week, all year long. School-trained tutors are matched with students in K–3rd grade who are in need of reading support. By planning the tutoring programming at the public library instead of the school, families may be more inclined to participate because it is a less intimidating environment. Family Literacy Nights are designed for the whole family to come in and enjoy reading activities together. The kids hear from a community partner to help bolster vocabulary and parents are able to spend time with our school partner to learn activities to take home.

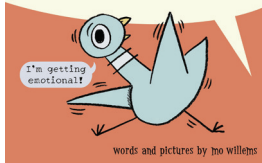

Brain Boxes are kits that are created to target the individual reading needs of the children. The Boxes contain games and books that encompass one of the components of learning to read: Phonics, Phonemic Awareness, Fluency, Vocabulary, and Comprehension. The families can take the kits home and play the games that help support the child's reading ability. These three prongs all work in conjunction with each other to bolster kid's confidence in their reading which will create more successful students.

This past year, our program tutored 75 students from eight different elementary schools and saw a 28% reduction in kids reading below grade level. Funding is provided in part by the Institute of Museum and Library Services through the Library of Michigan, the Friends of the Petoskey Public Library, the Hestia Women's Giving Circle, and those who donated to the program in memory of Roger Srigley. Many thanks to all our supporters.

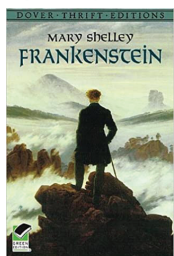
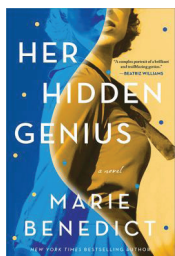

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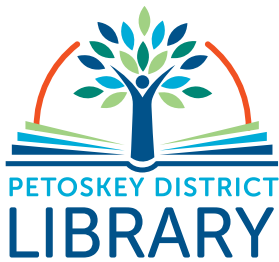
