The Flat, once called the Pit before it was filled, a very popular hang out when classes are filing out. Many people feel that the Flat is a place to sit and talk before class begins.









































# CLIMBING TO THE TOP






# Making Music In The Streets




# Working Together Makes it Better




# Focus on the Details




## Hard days in English and Social Studies!


# Picture Perfect



## Graduates




# Shot of Fun


