





Senior Class History

Four years ago we banded together, approximately one hundred and twenty-five strong, to organize the Class of 1945. Graduation seemed a long way in the future then, but looking back, those four years don't seem as long as we thought they'd be. In the meantime, we started things off with a bang by electing Doug Bain our president, with Faye Weber and Betty Knight as his assistants in governing the political affairs of the class. In the spring, our main activity was the picnic at Magnus State Park.

September, 1942, brought us to the dubious honor of being sophomores — and after being freshmen for a whole year, it was an honor! Marge Larson was our president, Mel Horniman, vice-president, and Jane Parks, secretary. We sponsored a concession at a game, and again had loads of fun on the picnic, held at Petoskey Beach that year.

Being juniors was even more fun than we'd expected — the most interesting and carefree of the four years, perhaps. Doug Bain again took over the reins of presidency, with the assistance of Pat Keating and Gerald Cooper, vice-president and secretary, respectively. The class play, "Street Car In the Attic", was quite successful and helped materially with the ac-

cumulation of funds for the J-Hop. We also sponsored game concessions and even a few baked-goods sales to raise money for this important project. Loyal cooperation among the gang of kids who worked so hard on J-Hop plans was what put over both the dance and dinner, held on separate nights for the first time.

When a few of our boys left for the armed services, and with more of them leaving later, the war seemed much closer. Thus it was on rather a grim note that our senior, and final, year in PHS began. Emerging triumphant from the spirited elections were Pat Keating, president; Don McCalmon, vice-president; and Bob Ernst, secretary. The year passed a lot more quickly than we had expected it would, but what with dances, game concessions, and of course the senior play, "Every Family Has One", which was presented on two nights for the first time in many years, our time was put to good purpose.
